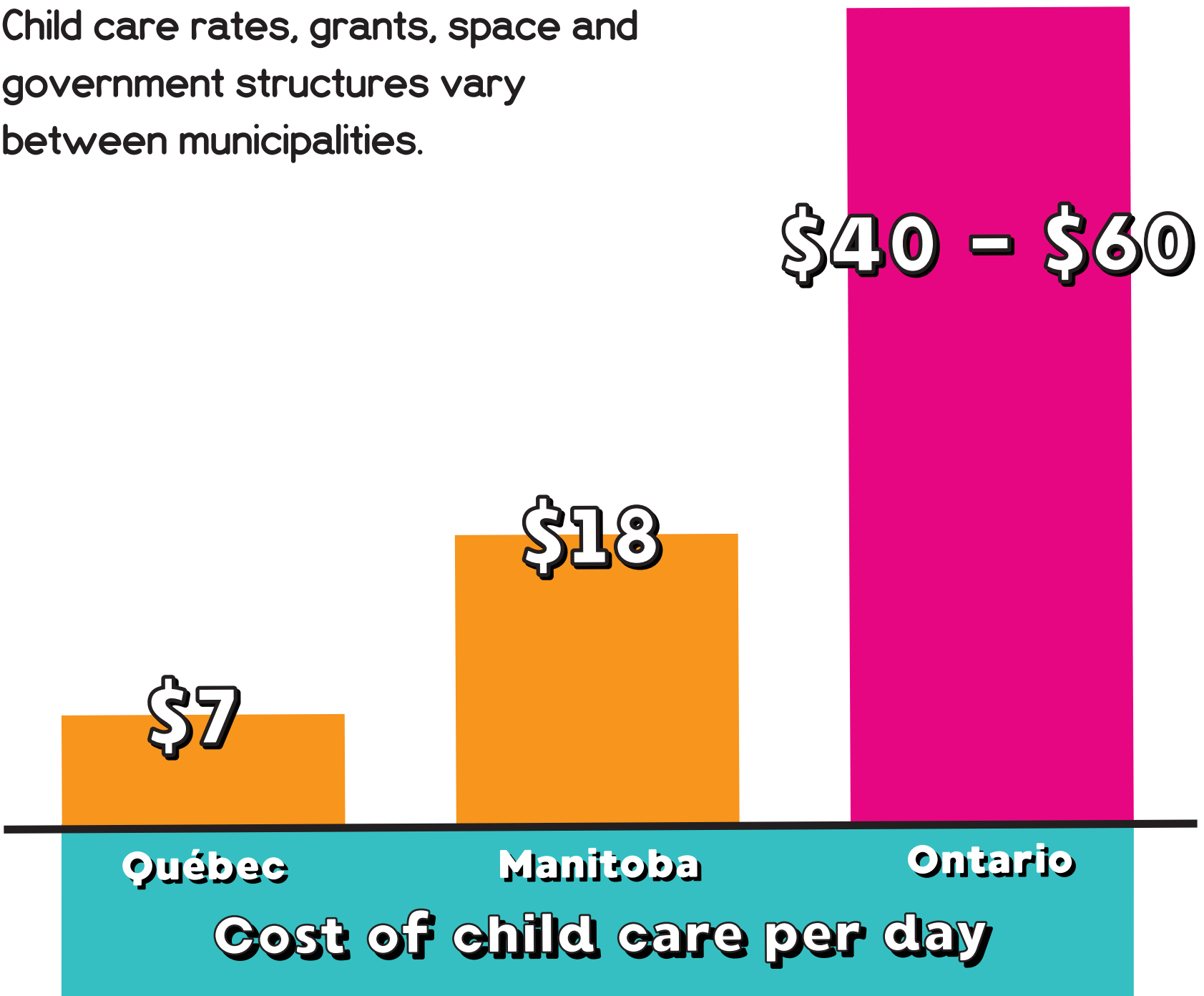




Child care rates, grants, space and government structures vary between municipalities.

On October 22, 2018, municipal elections will be held in all municipalities across Ontario.

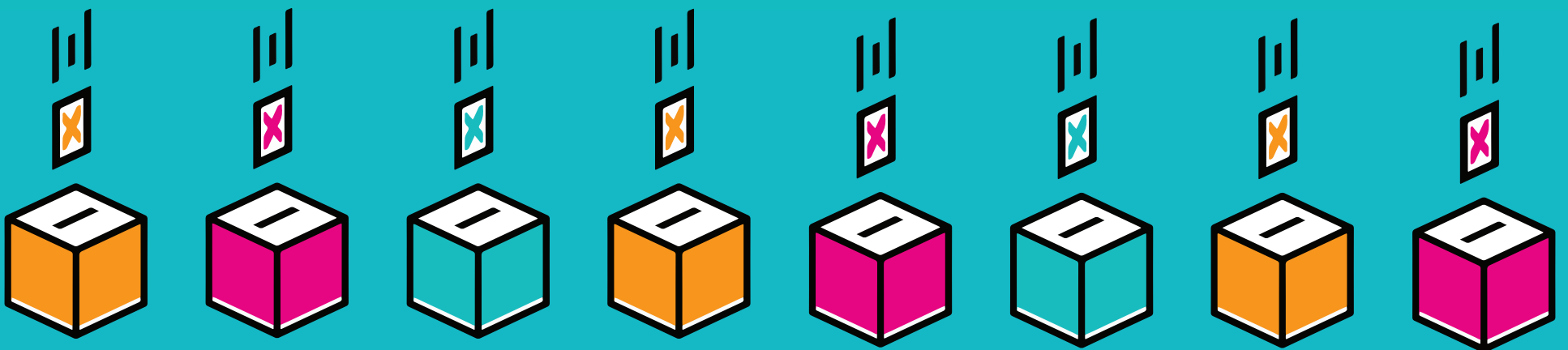
#### If you are

#### What to bring when you go vote:

- Proof of identification with name and address.
- Examples of accepted identification include (but are not limited to):
  - Ontario driver's license
  - Ontario health card
  - Ontario photo card
  - Mortgage, lease or rental agreement
  - Credit card statement
  - Bill for hydro, telephone, internet, water or gas
  - Insurance policy
  - Transcript or report card from a post-secondary school

\*Canadian passports are not acceptable as identification
